Daniel Brumberg	Senior Non-Resident Fellow at the Arab Center Washington DC, and Professor of Political Science and Director of Democracy and Governance Studies at Georgetown University. He is also a Senior Non-Resident Fellow at the Project on Middle East Democracy (POMED).
Haider Saeed	Department Head at the Arab Center for Research and Studies and Editor-in-Chief of the journal <i>Siyasat Arabia</i> . He previously worked as a consultant to the Iraqi Center for Strategic Studies and to the Future Foundation in Amman (2010-2011). His written work has most recently featured in <i>The Islamic State Organization: "Daesh," Volume Two,</i> published by the Arab Center for Policy Studies.
Imad Harb	Director of Research and Analysis at Arab Center Washington DC. He is the Founder and Director of Quest for Middle East Analysis, and previously Adjunct Professor of Middle East Studies at the Center for Contemporary Arab Studies at Georgetown University. His published work focuses on civil-military relations, regional politics, and US policy in the Middle East, North Africa, and the Arab Gulf.
Marwan Kabalan	Associate Researcher at the Arab Center for Research and Studies and Head of the Political Studies Unit, previously Director of the Al-Sham Center for Studies and Research and Dean of the Faculty of International Relations at the University of Kalamoon in Syria.
